**City of North Platte Proposition No. 1**

"Shall the Governing Body of The City of North Platte, in the State of Nebraska, impose an additional sales and use tax of one-half of one percent (½%), resulting in an aggregate sales and use tax of two percent (2%), upon the same transactions within such City of North Platte on which the State of Nebraska is authorized to impose a tax to pay for constructing public infrastructure projects including, but not limited to, expansion and renovation of the North Platte Recreation Center, which is expected to be paid for with approximately 86% of such tax and is the subject of an interlocal agreement between the City of North Platte and the North Platte Public School District, revitalization and expansion of the Cody Pool, creation of a water park at Cody Pool, and relocation of the skate park (together, the "Projects"), including paying the principal and interest of bonds used to finance the Projects to be issued in one or more series in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed Fifty-Two Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$52,500,000) as the same fall due, with said additional sales and use tax to remain in effect for a period of ten years from the time of its first going into effect or, if bonds are issued to pay the costs of said Projects and the additional

sales and use tax is pledged for payment of such bonds, upon payment of such bonds and any refunding bonds, whichever is later, and shall the City of North Platte increase its budgeted restricted funds for the 2023-2024 fiscal year by \$3,266,666, or 17.2%, over the City's current fiscal year's restricted funds."

If a majority of the votes cast upon such question shall be in favor of said bonds, additional sales and use tax, and increase in restricted funds budget, then the governing body of such incorporated municipality shall be empowered as provided by sections 77-27,142 and shall forthwith proceed to impose the additional one-half percent (1/2 %) sales and use tax pursuant to the Local Option Revenue Act. If a majority of those voting on the question shall be opposed to said bonds, additional sales and use tax, and increase in restricted funds budget, then the governing body of the incorporated municipality shall not impose the additional sales and use tax.

Electors voting in favor of said proposition shall blacken the oval opposite the words "FOR said bonds, additional sales and use tax, and increase in restricted funds budget" following said proposition, and electors voting against said proposition shall blacken the oval opposite the words "AGAINST said bonds, additional sales and use tax, and increase in restricted funds budget" following said proposition.
