August 21, 2023 North Platte, Nebraska

Meeting of the Lincoln County Board of Commissioners. Present were Commissioners Joe Hewgley, Kent Weems, Micaela Wuehler, Chris Bruns, Jerry Woodruff and County Clerk, Rebecca Rossell. Bruns offered prayer. Woodruff called the meeting to order at 9:00 A.M.

Chairman Woodruff announced the Open Meeting Act with amendments is posted for public review and the county board will comply with the open meeting requirements.

Motion by Weems, seconded by Hewgley to approve the minutes regarding the Lincoln County Board of Commissioners meeting held on August 14, 2023. Upon roll call vote Hewgley, Weems, Wuehler, Bruns and Woodruff voted "aye". Nays, none.

Motion by Wuehler, seconded by Hewgley to receive and order filed the treasurer's receipts. Upon roll call vote Hewgley, Weems, Wuehler, Bruns and Woodruff voted "aye". Nays, none.

No action was taken on the amendment to the food service contract with Summit Food Service LLC for the Lincoln County Detention Center.

The Lincoln County Board of Commissioners recessed at 9:15 A.M. and the Lincoln County Board of Equalization convened.

Chairman Woodruff announced the Open Meeting Act with amendments is posted for public review and the county board will comply with the open meeting requirements.

County Assessor, Julie Stenger appeared along with Alex Gurciullo, County Treasurer.

Motion by Hewgley, seconded by Weems to approve the minutes regarding the Lincoln County Board of Equalization meeting held on August 14, 2023. Upon roll call vote Hewgley, Weems, Wuehler, Bruns and Woodruff voted "aye". Nays, none.

Motion by Hewgley, seconded by Wuehler to approve and authorize the Chairman to sign the certificates of correction or refund submitted by the County Assessor on real property. Upon roll call vote Hewgley, Weems, Wuehler, Bruns and Woodruff voted "aye". Nays, none.

Motion by Weems, seconded by Bruns to approve the motor vehicle tax exemption application submitted by Great Plains Health as recommended for approval by the County Treasurer. Upon roll call vote Hewgley, Weems, Wuehler, Bruns and Woodruff voted "aye". Nays, none.

Motion by Wuehler, seconded by Weems to approve and authorize the motor vehicle tax exemption applications submitted by American National Red Cross as

recommended for approval by the County Treasurer. Upon roll call vote Hewgley, Weems, Wuehler, Bruns and Woodruff voted "aye". Nays, none.

Motion by Hewgley, seconded by Wuehler to approve the motor vehicle tax exemption application submitted by Community Action Partnership of Mid-Nebraska as recommended for approval by the County Treasurer. Upon roll call vote Hewgley, Weems, Wuehler, Bruns and Woodruff voted "aye". Nays, none.

The Lincoln County Board of Equalization adjourned at 9:22 A.M. and the Lincoln County Board of Commissioners reconvened.

Presentation by Three + One, a company that offers liquidity and treasury analysis services. Kyle Cline of NACo and Bill Cherry of Three + One were present through video. They are preferred partners with the National Association of County Officials as well as the Nebraska Association of County Officials. They are a data provider to supplement information to the County Treasurer. The fee structure for these services would be a maximum annual total fee of \$15,000.

Discussion was held following the presentation concerning the reports, forecasting, evaluations, and ongoing analysis offered by Three + One.

Commissioner Hewgley wondered what the initial cashvest analysis cost would be to Three + One.

Cherry replied he was not sure, but he would estimate between \$5000 to \$7000.

Commissioner Weems asked about compliance with Nebraska State Statutes.

Cherry affirmed they are very familiar with Nebraska State Statutes as they already serve Cuming, Lancaster, and Douglas counties in Nebraska. They also look at internal investment policies as well.

Commissioner Woodruff asked where the county's money is currently invested.

County Treasurer, Alex Gurciullo, replied that it is all invested in Lincoln County.

The public service agreement with Three + One who is a preferred partner with the Nebraska Association of County Officials and the National Association of County Officials was tabled for further discussion and review.

The following bids were received for the Sutherland North River Bridge Project: Simon - \$6,276,000; K2 Construction - \$7,097,039.44; Midwest Infrastructure Inc. - \$6,847,307.31; and KEA Constructors - \$5,240,480.49.

County Board acknowledged receipt of bids and asked the highway supt., engineer, and legal counsel to review the bids. The engineers project estimate was \$6,653,915.

Review of bids will also need to be conducted by the State of Nebraska Department of Transportation.

Susan Maline, CPA, presented the 2023/2024 preliminary budget for Lincoln County.

Discussion was held on an interlocal agreement with the City of North Platte for dispatch services. North Platte Police Chief, Steve Reeves, reported they currently have 12 dispatchers and one supervisor. They did a study and with an increase in call volume and additional staffing it was determined they need to add two additional dispatchers. They are requesting to split the cost with Lincoln County. Lincoln County would pay for three dispatchers in the proposed agreement, instead of two dispatchers, in the amount of \$293,604.00 which would be effective October 1, 2023.

Commissioner Bruns asked for a call volume comparison between calls for the City of North Platte and calls outside the city limits.

Reeves stated the call volume for last year was approximately 33,000 for the city and for the county in the range of 12,000.

Sheriff Kramer stated the county has moved past the point of having a separate dispatch for LCSO and sees no need to duplicate services.

Motion by Wuehler to enter in the interlocal agreement with the City of North Platte for dispatch services effective October 1, 2023. The motion was withdrawn.

The interlocal agreement with the City of North Platte was tabled for further discussion and clarification.

The building and grounds committee along with Region 51 Emergency Management Director, Brandon Myers, met and determined that it was not fiscally responsible to accept any of the bids for the proposed multi-purpose storage building for Region 51 Emergency Management and other county offices.

Motion by Bruns, seconded by Weems to reject all bids for the multi-purpose building for Region 51 Emergency Management and other county offices. Upon roll call vote Hewgley, Weems, Wuehler, Bruns and Woodruff voted "aye". Nays, none.

Deputy County Attorney, Tyler Volkmer, gave them information about making a special purchase pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. 23-3109(3) concerning this storage building.

Commissioner Weems commented that the committee had discussion about various options moving forward.

Hear concerns from Elected Officials, Department Heads, or their representative.

Approve the following claims for payment. Motion carried.
